- SPARC compliance: Deadline July 30, 2021.
 - O This year is not like the other years, in that CUNY Central and the GC will actually be enforcing the SPARC compliance. So if you do not do the SPARC, ESPARC, and WVP training, and email Eric Brown (ebrown2@gc.cuny.edu), you will face Financial Aid holds, and Registration holds for the next semester. For international students, this may even affect your visa status if you cannot be registered full time. So please do this ASAP.

- 2.14% turnout -- not ideal but up from 1.5% last year.
- I am preparing the election ballot now. Katie and Christian, the OGM and Officer for Funding, helped me tremendously with the election prep. I'm so grateful. I will run the ballot by the Student Election Review Committee and then launch it on April 1, 12AM. Elections will close May 3, 11:59PM. Please please encourage your departments to vote. B. Co-Chair for Communications (Rod Hurley)

Recent Meetings:

- 3/10 Graduate Council Meeting Agenda and Materials
 - The GC received accreditation from the Middle States Committee on Higher Education following last year's review.
 - The Grad Council voted to grant the following degrees: PhD-72, DMA-4, MA-54, MS-11, &
 MPhil-111
 - O The proposal for a Budget Committee of the Graduate Council was approved with a few amendments Chief Librarian, and Senior Advisor to the President for Diversity and Inclusion were added as an ex-officio members; term for a masters student elected to the committee was reduced from 2 years to 1 year. The committee includes 8 faculty members, 3 staff members, and 5 students.
 - New degree proposal MS in Astrophysics
 - Ph.D. Program in Comparative Literature bulletin changes (GRE req. removed)
 - Ph.D. Program in Earth and Environmental Studies 2 revised courses
 - o MS Program in Nanoscience 4 new courses
 - MA Program in Biography and Memoir revised governance
 - O MA Program in International Migration Studies revised governance
- 3/12 DGSC Exec Committee meeting with President Garrell and Interim SVP Peterson
 - GCFs reduced from 180 to 118, with flexibility to allow programs to not admit anyone -Classics may be exploring this.
 - "Savings" will be used in 2 ways 1) Provide 6th-year grad Ds (with NySHIP) and 2) support accepting diverse students through the PEF, which went up from 18 to 25 (permanent increase) and widened eligibility to include science students.
 - O Tuition fellows cut in half, they want to rethink those to be more supportive of lower income students.
- 3/17 Co-Chairs Meeting with Office of Student Affairs
 - O They are planning to have at least one or 2 courses in person for each Program in the Fall 2020 semester.
- 3/18 GC Reactivation Committee Monthly Meeting
 - o In accordance with CUNY guidelines, the GC is aiming for about 25% in-person "activity" in the Fall 2020 semester. They are still working out which classes and activities will be in person, as well as logistics for access and use of the building. The CDC is discussing reducing the social

- distancing requirement to 3 feet. Which would allow the GC to increase occupancy. The deadline to finalize plans for Fall 2020 is sometime in the summer.
- O Currently the plans include: all pantries and cafeterias closed; access via 5th avenue only, with designated doors for entering and exiting; 1 person in an elevator at a time;
- 3/18 Meeting with staff from Information Technology
 - STF committee will be meeting soon to approve proposals for spending the Student Technology Fee. The deadline for proposals has passed but committee members may bring proposals to the meeting. If you have an idea

C. Co-Chair for Business (Adam Kocurek)

- After voicing our concern as an executive committee to GC admin over the underrepresentation of student voices on the provost search committee, I have been asked to join Raj Korpan as a student member. The proceedings are strictly confidential, but I am using my new role to advocate for the hiring of a Provost who represents the needs of our institution and of the student body. If you have questions or concerns regarding the provost position, please let me know.
- We experienced a small drop in enrollment, which is usual for the Spring semester. As such, I have had to make some changes to our budget. However, I've kept the program allocation and chartered organization numbers artificially inflated at 2X their normal numbers for the Spring semester, so that program representatives and chartered organization leaders can best attend to the needs of their departments.

- Please note for gift cards, per GC regulations, please keep individual gift card purchases to a \$15 maximum, but students can receive more than one gift card.
- IMPORTANT: Anna Metreveli of the Business Office will be taking off June 14-July 2.
 - o From past experience with the DGSC, we will likely have lots of payment requests by the end of fiscal year. Please submit your FY2021 requests by June 1, 2021 this way we can issue and mail checks before she leaves. Any check requests submitted while she is gone will be automatically included in the FY2022 budget. Wei, the other Business Office worker, might be able to issue emergency wire payments, but not checks because she does not go to the office. So checks submitted after this date may take longer to reach you.
- Due to a server upgrade, the Works website experienced some problems in late February/early March. F. Officer for Technology & Library (Edward Charnley) Library

- A) The Library has added a new database for streaming and uploading educational video content online
 - This is expected to be particularly useful for teaching see Alexanderstreet.com for more details.
- B) The Library is still waiting to hear from Brian Peterson regarding a walkthrough assessment of the library to prep for reopening physical spaces.

 That is expected to take place in the Fall Semester.
- C) Some concern has been expressed from the library regarding its lack of presence on the provost hiring committee. Julia Wrigely has made a plethora of promises regarding the permanency of cuts to funding and admissions it would be nice to have a sense of certainty that this was not in the spirit of that ancient proverb "promise freely today what tomorrow will be another's responsibility to provide."
- D) The library intends to ask for a larger share of the STF budget.
 - a) It is my position that these requests should be supported by the DGSC. It is time for us to accept the realism of apprehensions regarding the impact that cuts will have on the Mina Rees.
 - If the library does not receive this funding, it is not a case of restricted acquisitions they will be forced to start cutting back on digital resources such as databases. This will begin with "unique and specific" resources which are used by only small numbers of students. We should be clear about what this

represents; the Mina Rees is being forced to abandon its mission as a research driven library.

Unless other DGSC members have strong feelings regarding some other STF proposal, I intend to vote for a greater share allocated to the library in committee.

IT

- **A)** IT now offers a live chat service during regular business hours.
- **B)** A new virtual assistant or "AI Chatbot" is now available.
- C) Email scams continue to be a major problem. IT has now introduced Multi-Facor Authentication (MFA). MFA adds a second layer of security to a user's e-mail accounts by requiring two factors to verify identity. These factors include something you know your username and password, and something you possess a smartphone app or verification code delivered via SMS text. Office 365 MFA will significantly reduce fraud and identity theft among Graduate Center students.
- D) a new Student Tech Fee webpage that provides clear answers to commonly asked questions by students, faculty, and staff; offers a new request form for STF funded projects; and delivers anticipated transparency to the approved collection of STF projects for the current fiscal year. The Student Tech Fee Committee approved funding for several resources for this fiscal year that includes the continued support for library databases and subscriptions, routine replacement of student computers (PCs/Macs), support for student printing consumables, and support for disability access technology.
- **E)** A limited number of laptops and hotspots are still available on a first come first served basis.
- **F)** A limited number of Adobe Creative licenses are still available.
- **G)** Bi-annual IT Assessments take place this month, which give members of the GC Community an opportunity to personally meet with an IT staff member to share any IT-related issues/matters, make hardware and/or software requests and seek assistance with automating specific business processes. Heads of programs, departments and centers, and institutes will receive an invitation soon.
