III. Executive Committee Reports

A. Co-Chair for Student Affairs (Sharanya Dutta)

- First and most importantly, PLEASE complete your SPARC training. Program Reps, At-Large Reps, DGSC EC and Steering, Social Media Correspondent, Affiliate Leaders, Chartered Org Leaders—ALL OF YOU/US HAVE TO COMPLETE SPARC TRAINING. It's under "My Organizations" in Blackboard. We technically cannot work for the DGSC and receive a stipend without completing this SPARC training.
- Chartered Org rosters need to be completed and reports submitted by December 20, 2021 for all chartered orgs. For those of you who manage chartered orgs, you know what a pain it can be getting people to sign the roster, so please be generous and sign other chartered orgs' rosters. Program and At-Large reps, please take a few minutes out of your day to help them out. Mobilize friends in your department and other departments, please. IF YOU ARE NOT ACTIVE (i.e. if you have not submitted the report and you do not have 20 signatures on the roster by Dec 20), YOU CANNOT BE REIMBURSED FOR THE MONEY YOU SPEND. Please reach out to me with any questions about this process.
- Several chartered org leaders have written to me about updated leadership, and wanting to re-activate chartered orgs that are about to be de-chartered. Thank you! I think I responded to everyone but if I didn't, please send me a reminder? We're in the middle of an excruciatingly prolonged website upgrade and because of tech issues, all of our chartered org leaders' names have been removed from their org pages. I have to manually re-enter them all which is taking a little time so please bear with me. Please also check your chartered org pages in a few weeks, and if any of the leaders' names are out of date, email me. Finally, when you submit your reports for the previous semester, Spring 2021, to me by Dec 20, please make sure you are mentioning who the UPDATED LEADERS/MOST RECENT LEADERS are so I can double check those names against my records.

B. Co-Chair for Communications (Deborah Leter)

Activites/Recent Meetings:

- 9/27: Meeting with President Robin Garrell
 - We talked about the importance of clear and open communication, and I mentioned that in my brief time as CCC so far this seems to be a major issue affecting students at the GC: students aren't getting email responses/updates/guidance they need from admin.
 - President & Provost are organizing a virtual town hall on October 27th (12-1:30).
- 10/13: Co-chairs meeting with Office of Student Affairs
 - Please complete your SPARC training! This is mandatory for you to continue as a DGSC representative.
 - I reiterated student concerns around the new incomplete policy and was told there are no positive updates on this front, and that we should bring this up to the President and Provost. The DGSC's Executive Committee (Co-Chairs, USF and USS) were supposed to meet with the Provost in the last few weeks but the meeting was postponed, so we will put pressure on this issue verbally during our upcoming meeting.
 - Please contact the LVA (Local Vaccine Authority) if you have not received your individual Cleared4 link to enter CUNY buildings (<u>lva@cuny.gc.edu</u>).

Vaccination: 37 GC students who are taking classes remote who haven't uploaded their vaccine information yet. Religious exemptions for vaccine (11), medical exemptions (8). All students should upload their vaccine docs if they have them, even if they're only taking online classes now.

Updates:

- **Out-of-state tuition issue:** When I met with President Garrell, I brought up the issue of master's students being excluded in the recent GC and CUNY Central resolution (that extends the out-of-state tuition waiver for this academic year for students who were unable to establish residency in New York last year). See President Garrell's September 2 email about this resolution. It does not seem like this issue is going to budge, so I've worked with the #OutofStateCUNY campaign to write a statement of support for MA students that I will present to you all for a vote later on in this meeting. If the vote passes unanimously, I will then send this statement to the Chancellor and Board of Trustees.
- We're opening up the DGSC's rooms! We've finally received the green light to do so. Please look at the "rooms reservation" page on the DGSC's website for updated information and pictures of the 4 DGSC rooms that are open to students, including important info on room occupancy limits. Our new guidelines:
 - If you want to reserve one of these rooms to teach Zoom classes in, you can do so through your Works account. You can reserve these rooms for 2 hours at a time, 16 times throughout the semester, and just need to upload your teaching schedule to the reservation form.
 - These rooms are also open, as they used to be, for small student-led events or meetings. You just need to follow the COVID guidelines and reserve the room through Works.
 - Students can start making reservations next week. I will be sending out an email to the student body about this as well.

C. Co-Chair for Business (Adam Kocurek)

Updates:

- We have begun the process of cleaning the DGSC lounge, which has involved throwing out expired materials and creating a list of things to purchase (coffee, tea, etc.) if there are items or amenities that you would like to have available in the DGSC lounge, please tell a DGSC officer! We have historically provided safer sex supplies, including condoms and lubricant, as well as snacks and refreshments, first aid materials, hygiene products, etc. We are going to be leaving the lounge open for public use, provided people comply with the COVID guidelines for the building.
- Once our budget is voted upon, I will generate the new and enlarged program and chartered organization allocations, and will update the program representatives as to their new allocation totals.
 - Things to remember:
 - The building seems to be allowing for some small in-person activities in the building, but it is likely that they will not be okay with large department parties until the Spring semester, when we are expected to return to 80% capacity. Please confirm with me in advance what your party plans are, if that is the route you plan to go with your allocations, just so I can confirm with our Business Office and Security that everything will be okay.
 - Remember that when purchasing supplies/food using DGSC money, you can use the NY state sales tax deduction form to get sales tax removed from your purchase. This form can be found on our website, or I can email it to you.
 - You can purchase alcohol with DGSC program allocation money.
 - Fall semester allocation DOES carry over to the Spring semester, but any money unspent by the end of the Spring semester gets reincorporated into our carryover, and the next CCB will be the one to decide how that carryover gets used.
- I am meeting virtually with our affiliate leaders soon to get their affiliate reports. I have already met with the Adjunct Project leaders, who have confirmed that over the summer they have been collecting data about the adjunct firing wave across the university in the midst of COVID, trying to get a better sense of which departments and schools were most adversely affected by the loss.
- Please remember to tell your peers that constituents that OpenCUNY and The Advocate are still offering website services and accepting newspaper article submissions for payment, respectively.
- The Graduate Education Task Force had its first meeting on 9/30/2021. It was mostly introductory, but we have an established schedule of meetings now. Our next meeting will be 10/29/2021.

D. USS Delegate (Edward Charnley)

Updates:

USS Nominations continue. USS scholarship deadlines have been extended to Oct 24th - they need help desperately with reading the applications.

USS elections will be held on Sunday -- the two candidates for Graduate Affairs are: Nerdeen Mohsen and Jacklyn Tomyln

Discussion:

JH (Comp Sci): We really need help on reviewing the USS scholarship applications, we have 1,000.

E. UFS Liaison (Parisa Montazaran)

Updates:

Since the previous Plenary I attended the 9/28 UFS Plenary, as well as the Reactivation Committee meeting on 10/14:

- UFS will continue to do business via teleconferencing until Jan 2022 when they will reassess suitable physical space to meet per Open Meeting Law
- CUNY has legal authority to request, not mandate Faculty and staff to vax; mandate would require union renegotiation of employment criteria
- Student mandate is effective; deadline for students to upload proof of vax was 10/7. University might force academic withdrawal, which could impact the students financial financial aid, etc.
 - 80% of students uploaded vax proof, but 25k have no documentation
 - If and how the university is going to execute is not clear to Marty Burke
 - One prof asked "if the university does drop students, is it possible that at some point in the future that students get vaccinated, would it be possible for them to then be readmitted to courses?" to which Marty said he has no idea yet.
 - Withdrawals could affect enrollment for this semester and going forward and university could levy sanctions through the board of trustees bylaws
 - as of 10/14, the Reactivation committee announced that refunds would be issued to students that paid in full and forced to withdraw but they do not want to "reward" students for not vaccinating
- CUNY Central is requesting 70% of classes in Spring be offered face to face; face to face would include hybrid-flex and 30% of classes would be either hybrid or fully online synchronous and asynchronous.
 - Hy-flex is not a modality, it is "an attribute of face to face courses" that allows for virtual participation the 30% would be hybrid and fully online courses.
 - concern about hy-flex and what that will mean for class size, some had classes go from 30 to 50; they want rules about what different classes mandate
 - Unclear if the CUNY Central has the authority to mandate what the modalities of instruction might be on a specific campus, let alone that every full time faculty member would be teaching at least one face to face class but they're doing it anyway - it was previously decided by individual faculty members, by departments, by divisions
 - Since NYS is no longer in state of emergency central office is flexing admin muscles and wants more uniformity
 - concern about no social distancing required next semester
- People were annoyed about change from everbridge and concerned with privacy/security in the transfer of data from one system to another
- People pissed that a month in there is no concrete details on Fall reopening policy, ie the Oct 7 mandate throwing enrollment into flux
- Overall university enrollment is down 7.6%, undergraduate enrollment is down 8.6%, first time freshmen down 11.5%

Discussion:

ZY (Physics): Students who didn't upload their vaccine documents might risk academic withdrawal, as you mentioned. Some students are still studying remotely in their home country and can't get a US-approved vaccine. How will the administration handle this issue? If students can't enter the US, they can't get a US vaccine. Will they still risk academic withdrawal?

PMO (Sociology): I'll make sure to bring this up at the next UFS plenary. Important point for international students.
